CHILD, ADOLESCENT AND MATERNAL HEALTH

12 mothers followed up to complete the Early Infant Diagnosis cascade.

28 individuals trained as grassroot soccer coaches.

24 men and duty bearers completed a training on Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF)

47 clients tested for HIV under Community Index testing.

408 clients of TB and HIV lost in care successfully followed up.

Home based care provided for 40 Non-suppressed HIV/TB clients.
